2003-04 State Accountability: MET

The Nebraska Department of Education makes this decision based on two indicators:

- Performance on the 4th state math assessment (at least 50% of students proficient); and
- Quality of the 4th state math assessments (at least a "good" rating).

2003-04 Federal Accountability (AYP): NOT MET (met 5 of 6 indicators)

Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) is the method used by the federal government to determine if school districts and schools have made adequate progress in improving student achievement. At the elementary level in Nebraska, AYP is based on the performance of fourth grade students relative to these six indicators:

- Performance on the state reading assessment (at least 62% of students proficient);
- Participation levels on the state reading assessment (at least 95% of students participating);
- Performance on the state math assessment (at least 65% of students proficient);
- Participation levels on the state math assessment (at least 95% of students participating);
- Performance on the state writing assessment (at least 62% of students proficient); and
- Quality of the state math assessments (at least a "good" rating).
