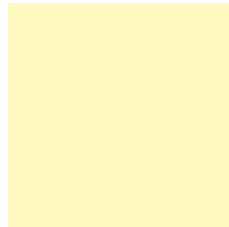

About Grand Island Public Schools

Grand Island Public Schools offer comprehensive education to students in pre-kindergarten through 12th grade. The school system is comprised of the Early Learning Center for pre-kindergarten students, 14 elementary schools for pre-kindergarten through fifth-grade students, three middle schools for sixth-through eighth-grade students, one high school for students in grades nine through 12, one alternative middle school, and one alternative high school. The district has approximately 9,000 students and employs approximately 1,400 people.

The Central Nebraska Support Service Program (CNSSP) is a three-county special education cooperative sponsored by Grand Island Public Schools. CNSSP provides identification, support, continuous assessment, individualized services for students birth through 21 years of age, and training opportunities for parents, staff, and community partners.

The English Language Acquisition (ELA) program serves English Language Learners in grades Pre-K through 12. One component of the ELA program is the Newcomers program, where students receive full-day ELL instruction in elementary schools and instruction in core subjects in secondary schools.

How to Enroll a Child in School

Students in grades K-8 attend neighborhood schools. Parents should call the Kneale Administration Building at (308) 385-5900 for attendance information. Items needed for registration include:

- The child's birth certificate (from the state)
- Parents' names, address, telephone number
- Names of places where parents work
- Names and birth dates of all brothers and sisters
- Immunization records
- The child's Social Security number
- Transcripts from any previous schools attended
- Proof of physical examination
- Name and address of someone other than parents to contact in case of an emergency
